I hope this message finds yo September, and the first two





Below are the bylaws that were approved at AGM:



OBJECTIVES

The Objectives of ACTIVE 20-30 are:

- a) To develop leaders who serve their communities.
- b) To serve the community with a focus on helping children.

ARTICLE V NATIONAL BOARD OF DIRECTORS: SECTION 13: REMOVAL

By an absolute two-thirds vote of the National Board of Directors (6 votes out of 8

Directors/Officers eligible to vote, or 5 votes out of 7 if the Immediate Past President has resigned),

any National Board Member, exception of the Executive Di



Directors, with the event of a violation of the

Active 20-30 US & Canada Duty of Loyalty Policy, Active 20-30 US & Canada Conflict of Interest policy (per the Active 20-30 US & Canada Policies & Procedures) or breach of any duty arising under California Corporations Code Article 3 Section 5230. If a voting board member other than the Immediate Past President has resigned from their position, a vote for removal cannot be held until the vacancy has been filled.

ARTICLE XIV LOCAL CLUBS: SECTION 4: MEETINGS OF THE CLUB: Each chartered Club shall hold at least one regular meeting each month and at least one board meeting each month.

ARTICLE XI: WORLD COUNCIL AND INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION

Remove entire section and amend Article XII to become Article XI; amend Article XIII to become Article XII; amend Article XIV to become Article XIV.




Member Spotlight - Devin Romo - Sebastopol #63
